



Essential rail repairs Fleet Street and Strachan Avenue

TTC service changes: July 29 to 31, 2024

What we are doing and why

From **July 29 to 31, 2024**, TTC track crews will be conducting essential rail and concrete repairs along the streetcar right-of-way on Fleet Street and Strachan Avenue.

These essential track repairs are part of TTC's preventative maintenance program to ensure safe and reliable streetcar operations.

Work activities, hours, and timeline

- The traffic and work zone set up will begin overnight **on Sunday, July 28**.
- Work activities will begin at **7 a.m. on Monday, July 29**, and will include concrete saw-cutting, concrete breaking/removal, rail replacement, and placement of new concrete. Work will continue until **Wednesday, July 31**.
- **Around-the-clock** work is required to ensure the quality installation of new rail and concrete.
- Concrete breaking/removal work will generally be completed during the daytime between 7 a.m. and 11 p.m.
- New concrete will be poured into the track area and set to cure before the road is fully re-opened to streetcar service and vehicular traffic by Thursday morning.

Motorist, cyclist, and pedestrian impacts

- All work will take place within the streetcar right-of-way (centre lane) on Fleet Street at Strachan Avenue.
- Due to the location of the work zone, there will be temporary traffic restrictions. Left turns will not be permitted at the Fleet/Strachan intersection.
 - Strachan Avenue: North-south traffic through the intersection will not be permitted. Northbound motorists will be required to make a right turn onto Fleet Street. Southbound motorists will be required to make a right turn onto Manitoba Drive.
 - Fleet Street: East-west traffic will be maintained through the intersection. Right turns will be permitted.
- Paid duty officers or flag persons will be on-site to assist traffic movements.
- Pedestrian access will be maintained.

TTC service impacts – 9 p.m., July 29 to 4 a.m., July 31, 2024

509 Harbourfront and 511 Bathurst streetcars will continue to operate through the area during the day. A nightly diversion will be in place until the work is completed.

509 Harbourfront Streetcars Diversionary Routing:

- **Eastbound:** Fleet Loop, east Fleet Street, south Bathurst Street, east Queen Quay West towards Union Station
- **Westbound:** west Queens Quay West, north Bathurst Street, west Fleet Street into Fleet Loop

509 Harbourfront Replacement Buses:

- **Westbound:** west Queens Quay West, north Bathurst Street, west/south Fort York Boulevard, west Lake Shore Boulevard, north Strachan Avenue, west Manitoba Drive into Exhibition Loop
- **Eastbound:** Exhibition Loop, east Fleet Street, south Fort York Boulevard, east Lake Shore Boulevard, merge left to Fleet Street, south Bathurst Street, east Queens Quay West, north Dan Leckie Way, east Lake Shore Boulevard West, south Lower Spadina Avenue.
- Wheel-Trans service will be maintained.

511 Bathurst Streetcar Diversionary Routing:

- All 511 Bathurst streetcars will divert to Fleet Loop on July 29 and July 30, 2024
- **Both ways:** south Bathurst Street, west Fleet Street into Fleet Loop.

511 Bathurst Bus Replacement Routing:

- **Southbound:** from Bathurst Station, south Bathurst, west/south Fort York Boulevard, west Lake Shore Boulevard, north Strachan Avenue, west Manitoba Drive into Exhibition Loop
- **Northbound:** from Exhibition Loop, east Fleet Street, south Fort York Boulevard, east Lake Shore Boulevard West, merge left onto Fleet Street, east Fleet Street, north Bathurst Street to Bathurst Station.
- Wheel-Trans service will be maintained.
